- 1) Providing MEAL technical support to the International Programme's team throughout the project cycle.
- 2) Leading on the development and implementation of Save the Children Switzerland's MEAL framework and processes, including the Evaluation and Learning Policy and agenda.
- 3) Supporting the monitoring and steering of the International Programme strategy.

What makes your role special

You will have a transversal role within the department and will ensure high-quality MEAL standards and processes are in place. You will contribute to internal technical approaches, evidence generation and standard setting relating to MEAL. At the project level, you will be involved in the full project cycle and support project teams at Switzerland and country office level in the development and implementation of strong project related MEAL systems and practices. Moreover, you will take the leadership in developing, strengthening and managing Save the Children Switzerland's MEAL framework and processes, including the Evaluation and Learning Policy and agenda. You will be responsible for evidence generation, internal and cross-sectoral learning, as well as accountability. You will also ensure that best practices and learnings are systematically captured, disseminated and used to improve programming.

- Master degree in a relevant subject or equivalent working experience.
- At least three years of relevant working experience, ideally including field assignments.
- Demonstrated ability to design and establish MEAL systems and processes.
- Strong skills in collecting, analysing, interpreting and encouraging the use of both qualitative and quantitative data.
- Knowledge and experience with major evaluation approaches and types.
- Ability to train staff in M&E, participation and accountability approaches.
- Ability to write clear and well-argued assessments, documents, reports.
- A flexible and initiative-taking, proactive, inspiring attitude with the ability to manage an unpredictable workload and to work effectively with teams from across the globe.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills in English. German or French a plus.
- Dedication to personal development and to the development of others.
- A commitment to Save the Children's mission and values.
- Previous experience using children-friendly participatory methodologies and/or in one of Save the Children Switzerland's core thematic area and/or in statistical and qualitative analysis software, a plus.
